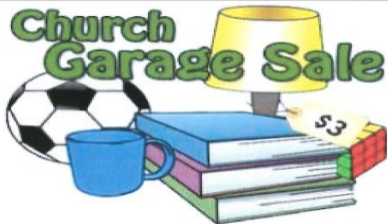

The Shepherd Speaks

The last several weeks we have been deluged with devastating tragedies from Hurricane Harvey to Hurricane Irma to Commemorating 9/11 to the insane threats by North Korea. In the midst of this unprecedented suffering we have seen some of the most courageous and heroic actions by total strangers urged on by just wanting to help those in need.

It reminds me of the time I spent at my first assignment in Texas City at St. Mary's. One summer I read a book whose topic was the Texas City Disaster. I remembered thinking how odd that back in April there had been not mention of any commemoration or service or anything made about the Disaster's anniversary. I inquired of several parishioners why no mention had been made. They informed me that they just wanted to forget it, as it had been such a horrible thing to live through. I included examples of heroism during those trying days in a homily not long after. Even their pastor, Fr. Roach, was killed in the second explosion that night. He had spent the day anointing the dead and dying and trying to comfort the injured. There were wonderful examples of Christians being Christians.

It is a shame that sometimes it is tragedies that bring out the best in us. But, the important thing is that our best does come out no matter the precipitating cause.
