Clergy Corner

Rite of Commitment for Confirmation

Dear Holy People of God,

As I write this, we are freshly back from a retreat with 46 of our youth preparing for Confirmation. The theme was “*Sinner to Saint*”. It was a profound and holy experience for all, with time for games and saint skits, even time to go canoeing (some falling in), time for prayer and sharing their faith with each other, but most importantly time to be alone and reflect on their relationship with God and being reconciled with Him.

By the time you read this, most of our Candidates for Confirmation will have just gone through the *Rite of Commitment*. They have been in the introduction period of the Confirmation process for almost 6 months. Now, our Candidates have to make a decision. At baptism their Parents and Godparents spoke for them. Now, they have to speak for themselves. Do they want to continue in the Confirmation process, which means following ever more closely as a disciple of Christ Jesus, getting to know Jesus more intimately? This is why in the Rite they were signed from head to toe with the Cross of Christ.

Those who choose to continue are asked to recall what the Holy Spirit brings into their lives. With the Holy Spirit, God brings three things – **Presence, Passion, and Power**. **Presence** – God is immanent, not only transcendent, meaning God is not only other, outside of us, but God is within us as the Holy Spirit. God cannot be any closer to us than His Spirit that resides in us. And this **Presence** brings a **Passion** to our lives, expressed as inspiration and enthusiasm for what is good, that actually leads us to our given mission in this life. And **Power** – power to do this mission. When we realize that we cannot do it on our own, God’s Spirit, God’s Love assists and strengthens us and we are able to accomplish things that we never dreamed we could.

I think this is my prayer for our young people who are preparing for Confirmation. That they come to realize more and more that the Holy Spirit is a *presence* in their lives that gives a *passion* for what is good and a *power* to make a difference in their world. My dear people, the same is true for us. We are all *Sinners* destined to be *Saints*.
